

ABSTRAK

Penelitian ini mengemukakan tentang peran Migrant CARE yang sangat signifikan untuk mendukung aturan pemerintah untuk membantu, memantau, dan melindungi pekerja migran perempuan Indonesia di Malaysia dengan menggunakan teori Organisasi Internasional yang dikemukakan oleh Clive Archer. Dimana terdapat tiga peran yaitu sebagai instrument, arena, dan juga aktor independent. Penulis menggunakan metode penelitian kualitatif deskriptif yang menggunakan sumber data primer dan sekunder. Teknik pengumpulan data yang penulis gunakan ialah dengan melakukan wawancara dan studi kepustakaan. Penulis menggunakan teknik analisis data kualitatif dalam melakukan analisis data yang nantinya akan dikaitkan dengan teori dan konsep sebagai referensi analitis. ABSTRACT

This research argued about the role of Migrant CARE is very significant to support the rule of government to assist, monitor, and protecting Indonesian female migrant workers in Malaysia using the International Organization theory proposed by Clive Archer. Where there are three roles of the International Organization itself which as an instrument, as an arena, and also as an independent. The author uses descriptive qualitative research methods that use primary and secondary data sources. The data collection technique that the author uses is by conducting interviews and literature studies. The author uses qualitative data analysis techniques in conducting data analysis which will later be associated with theories and concepts as analytical references.
